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## Right to academic mobility may be implemented on the basis of:

- international agreements on cooperation in the field of education and science;
- international programs and projects;
- agreements on cooperation between educational institutions.







## According to the place of implementation of the right to academic mobility, it is divided into:

internal academic mobility

international academic mobility





## By agreement between participants of academic mobility:

- participants of the educational process are selected for participation in academic mobility programs;
- the list of requirements and documents to confirm the participation in the academic mobility program as well as the procedure and the deadline for their submission are regulated;
- the stages, financial conditions, types and forms of academic mobility, duration and content of study and internship at higher educational establishments (scientific institutions) / partners are determined;
- the conditions for recognition of studying, internship or researches results and reporting of scientific and pedagogical staff are determined.

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


### What is Erasmus+?



**Erasmus+** is a program of the EU for the period of 2014-2020 that supports projects, partnerships, events and mobility in the field of education, training, youth and sport. The program budget for 2014-2020 is € 14.7 billion.

Together with more than 150 countries, Ukraine is one of the Erasmus + partner countries.







## MEMBER COUNTRIES OF THE PROGRAM ERASMUS+:

- 28 member states of the EU
- candidate countries that have Erasmus+ National agencies: Turkey, Macedonia and Serbia (since 2018)
- Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway

#### total 33 PROGRAM COUNTRIES

who have entered into a special agreement on full participation in the program, have paid membership fees and set up Erasmus + National agencies

In order to participate in the program Erasmus+, universities of the member countries of the program must have signatories of Erasmus+ Charter for Higher Education

#### **Credit mobility + individual scholarships**

#### Degree mobility: Joint master's and doctoral (PhD) programs + individual scholarships

Studying on a master's or doctoral (PhD) program at two or more universities of Erasmus+ member countries





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## KA1: International credit mobility

Inter-institutional agreement defines the scope, types and fields of science as well as the rules for participation in mobility (signed by partners before mobility begins, but after granting).

#### [Minimum requirements]4

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

## Commitments of higher education institutions (HEI) implementing the Erasmus+ Credit Mobility (KA1) project

Providing and conducting an open, transparent and equal access to competition for potential applicants for credit mobility participation.

It is the credit mobility project partners (International Relations or Academic Mobility Departments) who jointly (or independently in partnership) formulate the conditions of competition framework and the eligibility criteria for credit mobility participants.







## How a student can participate in Erasmus+ credit mobility

To participate in credit mobility, you must be enrolled in an educational institution

Contact the International Relations Department to learn about agreements with other universities on academic mobility





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#### Who takes part?

All educational levels: bachelors, masters, postgraduate students (except the first year and the last semester of study)

**In different fields of education** (subject areas)

#### Payment

- Scholarship payments for students 800-850-900 EUR / month
  Daily payments for teachers and staff 140-160-180 EUR / day
  Transportation costs minimum amount reimbursed for travel 20 EUR (10-99 km);
  maximum 1 500 EUR (8 000 km and more)

#### Duration

- students from 3 to 12 months
- ♦ internship from 2 to 12 months
- staff from 5 days to 2 months


TO FIND OUT in the International Relations Office, academic mobility coordinators or on the university website (https://ic.pnu.edu.ua) information on the availability of open competitions and conditions for participation in Erasmus+ Credit Mobility projects (KA1) to teach students, train and internship of employees





#### **STEP 2:**

- > Check your foreign passport
- > Prepare necessary documents
- > Apply for the competition in time





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# The conditions of competition framework and the eligibility criteria are:

- \*for students: a study cycle (bachelor, master or postgraduate), a course of study (except 1st year), an education field (specialty, specialization); a level of knowledge of a foreign language; student achievement ratings and teacher recommendations; motivation letter, etc.
- ❖ for teachers: an education field specialty, specialization; knowledge of a foreign language; a rating of teachers of the institution; etc.;
- ❖ for employees: a professional field managerial, administrative, financial competences; a level of knowledge of a foreign language; et al.
- ❖ for all candidates: a valid foreign passport; timely submission of necessary documents, prepared in accordance with the requirements of the competition; etc.

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


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STEP 3 (for teachers or administrative staff): Necessary documents

- 4. Motivation Letter







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
STEP 4: Getting a visa for the trip

Visa type: national, for studying

Duration: according to the estimated period of stay abroad







### RESULTS

- 1. The university is obliged to recognize the credits received for studying upon return (unless otherwise provided in the Agreement).
- 2. The mobility participant receives a certificate of participation in the form of Transcript of Records.
